RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

COMMENTS SOLICITED CONCERNING CHANGES TO THE EXCHANGE ACT CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM

The Commission is publishing proposals for comment which would expand the number of issuers relieved from the registration and reporting requirements of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 by increasing the total assets reporting threshold from \$3 million to \$5 million. These proposals represent a continuing effort by the Commission to alleviate the burdens to the smallest issuers of complying with such registration and reporting provisions to the greatest extent possible consistent with the protection of investors. Conforming amendments are also being proposed to Form 15 and to certain of the Commission's definitions of small entity under the Regulatory Flexibility Act.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST ROBERT H. PHILIPS

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against Robert H. Philips, a registered representative of a broker-dealer registered with the Commission. In the Order Instituting Proceedings, the Division of Enforcement alleges that Philips willfully violated antifraud provisions of the securities laws in options transactions in his customers' accounts by, among others things: effecting options transactions in clients' accounts which were excessively speculative and excessive in size and frequency; misrepresenting the risks involved in writing put options; and misrepresenting the potential rates of return in writing put options. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER ENTERED AGAINST SECURITIES TRANSFER, INC., OTHERS

The Commission announced that on September 30 U.S. District Judge G. Kendall Sharp, Middle District of Florida, entered a Temporary Restraining Order against Securities Transfer, Inc. (STI), Express Transfer, Inc. (ETI), Sharon Alfonso, Joseph Bumyea, also known as John Hanson (Bumyea), and Vernon Hulme. The Order was entered upon the Commission's application and accompanying papers, which were filed on September 30. The complaint alleged, among other things, that STI, Alfonso, Bumyea and Hulme obtained funds from other persons through pledging improperly issued stock certificates representing securities of companies using STI as a transfer agent. The Order temporarily restrains STI, Alfonso, Bumyea and Hulme from further violations of the antifraud provisions, STI and Alfonso from further violations of the transfer agent recordkeeping and security safeguarding provisions, and ETI and Alfonso from further violations of the transfer agent registration provisions, of the securities laws. The Order also enjoins Bumyea and Alfonso from transferring any invalidly issued stock certificates obtained from STI or ETI, and Hulme from transferring any stock certificates obtained from Bumyea. The Court scheduled a preliminary injunction hearing in this matter for October 10, 1985. (SEC v. Securities Transfer, Inc., et al., USDC MDFL, Orlando Division, Civil Action No. 85-1049-CIV-ORL). DOUGLAS BOSTICK CONSENTS TO PERMANENT INJUNCTION

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on September 3 U.S. District Judge Falcon B. Hawkins, District of South Carolina in Charleston, entered an order permanently enjoining Douglas W. Bostick of Charleston, South Carolina from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5. Bostick consented to a permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the March 2, 1983 complaint.

The complaint alleged that Robert W. Legare and Edward H. Martin sold promissory notes and limited partnership interests in violation of the registration provisions of the Securities Act from June 1981 to March 1983. The complaint further alleged that Legare, Martin and Bostick made false statements in the offer and sale of such securities, including that funds received in exchange for promissory notes would be used to purchase and sell common stock earning 110% to 120% annually, that funds invested in limited partnership interests would earn over 240%, and that such high returns could be obtained with little risk, when in fact these funds were used to purchase options on common stock and other high risk investments. WESTERN MASSACHUSETTS ELECTRIC COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing Western Massachusetts Electric Company, subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to issue and sell up to \$50 million of first mortgage bonds. (Rel. 35-23851 - Oct. 2)

CONNECTICUT LIGHT & POWER COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Connecticut Light and Power Company, subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to issue and sell up to \$150 million of first and re-funding mortgage bonds, in one or more series, from time to time through December 31, 1986. (Rel. 35-23852 - Oct. 2)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-85-26) to amend Appendix F to Article III, Section 34, of the Rules of Fair Practice. Appendix F regulates compensation that members, their affiliates and associated persons receive in connection with the distribution of public direct participation programs. The amendment would establish a safe harbor provision. Under the amendment, compensation received by an affiliate of a member will not be deemed to be received in connection with or related to a public offering if the affiliate complies with the criteria specified in Section 5(d)(1) of Appendix F. (Rel. 34-22485)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Rule changes have become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 by: Depository Trust Company (SR-DTC-85-3) reducing its surcharge on participants' monthly billings to ten percent from 15 percent. (SR-NYSE-85-35) amending Exchange Rule 116 regarding the handling of market-at-the-close orders in a stock on the last business day prior to the expiration of options and/or settlement of future contracts based on an index which includes such stock (commonly referred to as "expiration Friday").
