NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted under provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. In general, the Commission expects to follow a schedule of holding closed meetings on Tuesdays, and open meetings on Thursday morning. Meetings on Wednesday, and if necessary on Thursday afternoons, will be either open or closed according to the requirements of agenda items under consideration.

Visitors are welcome at all open meetings, insofar as space is available.

Meetings will be held in the Commission Meeting Room, Room 1C30, at the Commission's headquarters building, 450 Fifth Street, NW, Washington, DC. Persons wishing to photograph or videotape Commission meetings must obtain permission in advance from the Secretary of the Commission. Persons wishing to tape record a Commission meeting should notify the Secretary's office 48 hours in advance of the meeting.

OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, JULY 7, 1988 - 10:00 a.m.

The subject matter of the July 7 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of a two-part recommendation from its Division of Market Regulation concerning predispute arbitration clauses in broker-dealers' agreements with their customers. First, the Commission will consider a recommendation that it propose an amendment to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 that would prohibit a broker-dealer from conditioning investor access to brokerage services on the signing of a predispute arbitration agreement. The Commission will also consider whether to send a letter to each of the securities industry's self-regulatory organizations that currently operates an arbitration system requesting that they consider using their broad rulemaking authority to take independent action to effect the same result. (2) Consideration of whether to authorize for publication (1) a release adopting amendments to Regulation S-X that would require accountants' reports included in Commission filings to be signed by an independent accountant who within the last three years has undergone a peer review of its accounting and auditing practice, and (2) a release publishing for comment proposals to specify procedures to be used to review an accountant's audit work pending the accountant's compliance with peer review requirements when the accountant first becomes subject to the requirement due to accepting a Commission registrant as a client or a current client becoming a Commission registrant. (3) Consideration of whether to issue for comment proposed rules to require that registrants include a report by management in Forms 10-K and annual reports to shareholders. The management report would acknowledge management's responsibilities for the financial statements and internal control, discuss how these responsibilities were fulfilled and provide management's assessment of the effectiveness of the registrant's internal controls. The registrant's independent accountant would be associated with management's assessment of the effectiveness of internal controls through its existing responsibilities under generally accepted auditing standards. (4) Consideration of whether to adopt an amendment to Rule 2(e)(7) of the Commission's Rules of Practice to provide that Rule 2(e) proceedings shall be public unless the Commission, on its own motion or after consideration of the request of a party, otherwise directs. (5) Consideration of whether to adopt proposed Rule 19c-4 which would add to the rules of national securities exchanges and national securities associations, a prohibition on an exchange listing, or an association authorizing for quotation and/or transaction reporting on an inter-dealer quotation system, the common stock or other equity security of a domestic issuer if the issuer issues securities or takes other corporate action that would have the effect of nullifying, restricting, or disparately reducing the per share voting rights of any common stock of such issuer registered under Section 12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION SENDS LEGISLATIVE PROPOSAL TO CONGRESS

The Commission sent a legislative proposal to Congress that, if enacted, would amend the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal would eliminate unintended gaps in the statutory scheme. Specifically, the legislative proposal would require brokers and banks holding mutual fund shares on behalf of their customers to forward proxy materials to their customers. The recommended legislation would also bring information statements into the shareholder communications system. (Press Release 88-51)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE ENTERPRISE GROUP OF FUNDS, INC.

An order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) exempting The Enterprise Group of Funds, Inc. (Fund), together with Liquid Green Trust and Liquid Green Tax-Free Trust (Affiliated Money Market Funds) from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c) and 22(d) and Rule 22c-1 thereunder, and pursuant to Section 11(a) approving certain exchange offers. The order (1) permits the Fund to assess a contingent deferred sales charge (CDSC) on redemptions of shares of the Fund's existing and future series, and to engage in certain transactions in connection with the collection of the CDSC; (2) permits the deferral of any applicable CDSC on Fund shares exchanged for Affiliated Money Market Fund shares; (3) permits the waiver of CDSCs under certain circumstances; and (4) approves certain exchanges of shares among any of the existing and future series of the Fund and any of the Affiliated Money Market Funds. AMERICAN HOME ACCEPTANCE CORPORATION

An order has been issued on an application filed by American Home Acceptance Corporation, an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of Rausher Pierce Refsnes, Inc., a securities company, under Section 6(c) of the Act, conditionally exempting American from all provisions of the Act in connection with its sale of mortgage-backed securities. The National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-88-21) that would amend Article III, Section 21 of the NASD's Rules of Fair Practice to require the marking of customer order tickets for each transaction in a non-NASDAQ security to reflect the dealers contacted to determine the best inter-dealer market. Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
